It is inevitable that not all displays will appeal to all people but this should not limit the imagination and vision which can be applied to the Museum's ability to tell the story of all aspects of Australia and Australians.

My only real complaint is the appallingly uncomfortable seating in the Friends' lounge. For those less than 6 feet tall, the arm chairs do not provide a place to relax.
